- Could do with another member staff to support the sporting activities
- Challenging attitudes and behaviour of some young people when required i.e. swearing and teasing others
- Getting to know children, young people, and their families
- Contacting parents over child's attitude and or behaviour when at the centre and parents have been very supportive

What were the outcomes of this work? *(Did any of the young people progress? Did they enjoy the sessions? Have they learnt anything from the sessions? What themes have you covered e.g. crime, mental health, sexual health employment minimum of 50 word)*

- Encouraging children and young people to get more fit and active through the range of sporting activities on offer such as football, short tennis, badminton, boxing pads, obstetrical course, running & skipping and much more.
- Group games & tasks went well with the younger age group
- Ensure children and young people have the choice of either hot or cold food during every session including fresh fruit, milk, pasta dishes, meat dishes, chicken, yogurts and much more
- Introducing different meals and snacks to the children and young people has been well received by all
- Let's cook sessions gave children & young people the opportunity to gain new skills in cooking.,
- Further developed relationships with children, young people, and their families
- Discussions around mental health and services available, to crime within our communities, schoolwork, increase in bike crime, relationships, leaving junior school and going to high school.
- Arts & crafts sessions – time to relax and chat whilst making things to take home from mask painting, jewellery making, egg painting, pot painting, plant potting and taken them home to brighten up our gardens
- 1-2-1 work is going well – music resources are being sourced to support young person onto the next stage of his developments of his music skills
- Developing garden area – By buying plants, painting pots and planting in garden space
- Looking at making garden furniture out of pallets of wood with the help of the Reparation Team and young people for Targeted Services
- Play scheme went really well in relation to increased numbers of new children & young people registered, the various activities on offer, the levels of participation, opportunity to try new things, increased physical fitness and had lots of fun throughout whilst creating positive memories for Summer 2021. The trips out were very popular sessions with a full attendance for such session.
- Challenging attitudes and or behaviour of some of the children and young people has reduced ten fowled and therefore doing less challenging

From July 1<sup>st</sup> to October 4<sup>th</sup> Central Youth Club outcomes are as follows

- Delivered 80 face to face sessions
- Supported 16 Families with financial support towards school uniforms
- Provided 1018 meals to children & young people
- Provided 15 families with fresh fruit & veg packs
- Number of attendees 1453
- Provided a 5-week Summer Playscheme

On our trip to Gulliver's World one of the children looked like he was upset, when asked what was wrong his reply was I have never been on a luxury bus before and I pointed out that it has a toilet to, OMG was his reply.

It soon became apparent that a number of the children & young people had never been to a theme park before and were very excited for the experiences ahead.
